


Our theme today is based around a question: What does the Lord require? And we are going to consider this question by considering offerings and presents.

Remember the words of the devotion: I asked for all things that I might enjoy life I was given life that I might enjoy all things.

And we remember the gifts that God has given to us Things that we mentioned earlier:

A healing

A miracle

A helping hand when we most needed it

And of course the greatest gift of all – Our Lord Jesus And by believing in Him we have the gift of eternal life A hope for the future

I got nothing that I asked for – but everything that I had hoped for.

What will you give to God?

Love?

What does the Lord require of you?

Commitment?

Worship?

Everything?

Our reading asks the question:

What will you give to God? And what does God require from us? Love? Commitment? Worship? Everything?

At Christmas we sometimes sing the carol "in the Bleak Midwinter" words by Cristina Rossetti: The last verse of which goes like this:

What can I give Him, poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a Wise Man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give Him: give my heart.

This verse offers, as a solution, that we have nothing to offer but ourselves.

Sum Up

Give everything to God

Share God's Love with the world around you

Show by your example: That the key to life is a life given to Jesus.



So to sum up

Everything – what the Lord requires from us is to love Him with all our heart

- To be filled completely with His love
- And to share that love with the world around us
- Just as Hobbits we rejoice in giving gifts but not any gifts the only gift that really matters the gift of God's love that gives LIFE.
- And to show that by your example the key to life is a life given to Jesus.
